


Who We Are




















New Development & Redevelopment Programs

Brownfield Revolving Loan Fund Program (EPA)

Brownfields grants support revitalization efforts by funding environmental assessment, cleanup and job training activities.

Cleaning up and reinvesting in blighted areas increases our local tax base, facilitates job growth, utilizes existing infrastructure, takes development pressures off of undeveloped open land ... as well as improves and protects the environment.

- Awarded the city of Lithonia a Brownfield grant for Granite
 Crossing (formerly Lithonia Plaza) for a multi-use facility.
- ☐ The Granite Crossing developer is pursuing a Brownfield loan.








Demographic Dashboard – Population

DeKalb County is forecasted to increase its population by 22% by 2040




Demographic Dashboard – Millennials

- access to plentiful restaurants, bars and coffee shops.




The industries of highest growth for DeKalb between 2015 and 2040 are Construction (93.6%), Finance and Insurance (50.4%); Educational Services (48.3%) and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services (47.8%)

DeKalb is one of the most diverse counties in the region.

- 64 languages spoken throughout the county
- Clarkston is the "most diverse square mile in America"
- Home to the DeKalb Farmers Market and the Buford Highway Farmers Market and Corridor
- 70% of Chamblee area residents were born in a foreign country
- Home to 13 Consular and International Trade Organizations
- By 2040, more than 80% of DeKalb's population will be minority

DeKalb County – Quality of Life


- 11 of Atlanta Magazine's Top 50 Restaurants are in DeKalb

- Arabia Mountain is one of only 49 National Heritage Areas in the country


 130 parks consisting of approximately 6,000 acres of parkland and greenspace

Economic Development Strategic Plan

The Economic Development Strategic Plan was developed to create a roadmap for DeKalb County to become a leading force in attracting regional, national and international firms and entrepreneurs. It also provides strategies to support the expansion and success of existing businesses within the county.

PLAN

- 200 business stakeholders were surveyed and interviewed
- Strategic recommendations and target industries were identified

ESTABLISH

- 7 task force groups were created:
 - Community & Enhancements
 - Real Estate & Product Development
 - Existing Business & Entrepreneurship

- Marketing & Branding
- Tourism & Culture
- Incentives & Policy Reform
- Transportation and Infrastructure Improvements

MANAGE

- Over 80 recommendations were vetted
- Each task force addressed key steps to determine:
 - feasibility

- cost

- implementation

- timeframe for implementation

IMPLEMENT

- Identify primary and secondary stakeholders
- Form steering committee
- Begin implementation of recommendations

MONITORING & REPORTING

- Steering committee will be supported and administered by DDDA
- Periodic assessments will take place during implementation process
